| PROHIBITED ITEMS | To protect the safety of field employees and visitors, some items are NOT permitted in the planting area and may not be placed or affixed to monuments. Examples of prohibited items include, <u>but are not limited to</u> , the following: | | | | |

BUSHES & SHRUBS

- Bushes or shrubs are **ONLY** permitted on plots having <u>three graves or more</u>. Bushes or shrubs are <u>NOT</u> permitted on single graves, double graves, or any flat marker section.
- Rose bushes, vines, climbers, hedging, and perennials are NOT permitted on any gravesite.
- Shrubs and bushes are permitted to be planted on each side of the monument.
- Shrubs and bushes are **NOT** to extend in front or behind the memorial in excess of 14" nor to encroach upon any other plot.
- No shrub or bush is to exceed the following height restrictions:
 - 3 feet for a three grave lot
 - 4 feet for a four grave lot
 - 5 feet for a five grave lot
 - 6 feet for a lot that consists of more than five graves.
- Preferably, shrubs should be kept four (4) to six (6) inches below the maximum size permitted.
- Before planting any such shrubs, the Cemetery office should be consulted in order to be sure that your planting will conform to the type of shrub permitted and to its maximum size.





FAMILY (PRIVATE) MAUSOLEUM LOTS

- Annual flowers may be planted in front of the mausoleum building (not blocking the entranceway) when a landscape plan is approved by cemetery authorities. Annual flowers are <u>not permitted</u> in front of any flush markers that are part of a mausoleum lot.
- Shrubs and bushes are permitted on three sides of the building when a landscape plan is approved by cemetery authorities. Shrubs and bushes are prohibited in the rear of the building. Before planting, the cemetery office should be consulted to ensure that your planting will conform to the type/size of shrub permitted.
- No shrub or bush is to exceed the height of the mausoleum's door. Preferably, shrubs should be kept four (4) to six (6) inches below the top of the door.
- Shrubs and bushes are not to extend in front or behind the mausoleum in excess of 3'6", nor are they to encroach upon any other mausoleum or lot.
- Rose bushes, vines, climbers, hedging, and perennials are NOT permitted.
- Bouquet Holders are the only lot markers permitted. Each bouquet holder reduces the area reserved for planting. Owners are asked to limit bouquet holders to no more than four per mausoleum lot.
- Glass jars, statues, shells, vigil lights, marble chips and bric-a-brac of any description are not permitted and will be removed and disposed of without notice or compensation.
